Expect to have a great time!

Proper dance shoes are required

Find out what the appropriate shoe for class is when you sign up!

Dress code for ballet:

For girls, a leotard & tights of any color is required. Ballet skirts & shorts are fun, but no baggy clothes. For boys: No baggy clothes, a fitted shirt, fitted dance pants, tights, or shorts. Long hair must be pulled back. Long hair in a bun!

Dress code for all other classes:

We recommend a leotard & tights! A fitted top, ballet skirt, dance shorts, jazz or yoga pants are fun & fine choices too! No jeans or baggy clothes. Long hair must be pulled back! We recommend a bun! Baggy pants can only be worn in hip hop.

We are big on manners!

Being a successful dancer requires lots of patience. Please practice your patience immediately upon entering the school. Wait quietly in the waiting areas for your teacher.

Do not enter the studio without being invited in. Please do not interrupt classes!

Attendance

Attendance is extremely important. Dancers will be preparing for their annual recital. Each class becomes a team, and all team players need to be at practice. In group numbers, dancers have to work together. If one piece of the puzzle is missing, the puzzle cannot be completed properly. If the dancer needs to miss class, please call in advance so arrangements can be made.

“Tisk Tisk on Tardiness!”

Be on time for class! We realize everyone is human, and once in a while there's really awful snow to drive through! We just don't want our dancers to get hurt if they miss warm up, or make a habit of tardiness. Dancers entering the studio late are also a class distraction. A dancer more than five minutes late may not be allowed to participate, as they have missed part of warm up.

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Tuition Rates & Options

*Each class is one hour long, and meets weekly during the September - June season.

* The season's tuition can be paid in full, or in monthly installments.

*If you choose to pay monthly, cash, check or credit card payments are due a month in advance, within the first seven days of the month. September & October tuition is due by September 14th.

* For a 10% tuition discount (an entire month of tuition free!)

Payment in full by check or cash only for the entire season is due by September 14th, 2018 to receive the discount. . Private lessons are NOT eligible for the 10% discount.

Receive a \$100 sibling credit!

*This credit will automatically be used towards tuition payments. If tuition is paid in monthly installments, a \$10/per sibling credit will be applied automatically each month, for ten months. If tuition is paid in full by September 14th, a \$100 credit/per sibling will be applied to your total before the 10% discount is taken.
